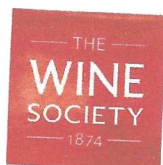

Bogle California Petite Sirah 2021

A full-bodied, bold and intense red. Deep purple in appearance, with flavours of blackberry conserve, mulberry and vanilla, this is a big, juicy wine that really packs a punch. There is grip and spice on the finish, with the significant structure supported by real depth of fruit.

Despite its name, there's nothing "petite" about this wine. Petite Sirah was first created in the late 1800s when the Syrah grape was crossed with a lesser-known French grape called Peloursin. The result? A bold, deeply colored red wine with remarkable strength and balance.

While its roots trace back to France, it found its true home in California, particularly along the Central Coast, where warm days and cool nights help it reach its full potential. The grape's small berries pack concentrated flavor and tannin, giving Petite Sirah its signature depth and intensity.

Petite Sirah Flavor Profile: What to Expect

If you love wines that make a statement, Petite Sirah will win you over at first sip. You'll notice aromas of blackberry, plum, and blueberry, with undertones of cocoa, black pepper, and spice. Each sip delivers layers of dark fruit, mocha, and vanilla that are held together by firm, balanced tannins.

It's bold, velvety, and luxurious, without ever feeling overdone.

We can't get enough of Petite Sirah because it's everything a great red wine should be: bold, smooth, and incredibly rewarding. It's a crowd-pleaser that impresses both casual sippers and serious wine drinkers alike.

How to Taste Petite Sirah Like a Pro

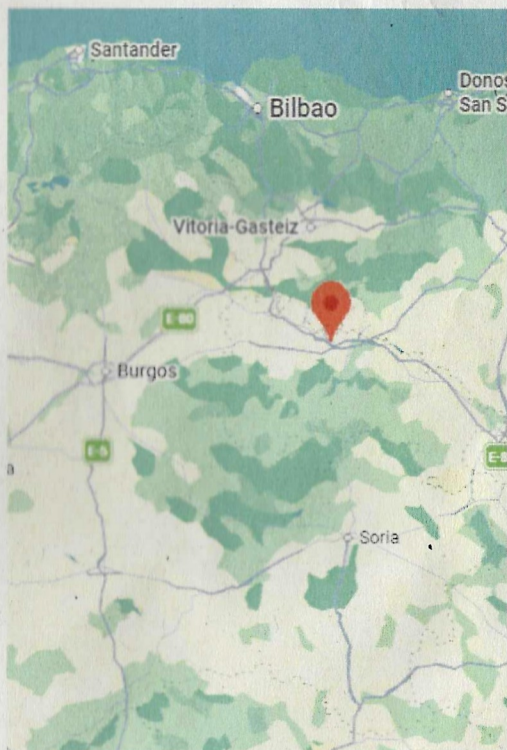
Tasting Petite Sirah is all about engaging your senses:

•*Swirl*: Notice the nearly opaque, inky color that clings to the glass.

•*Smell*: Take in layers of dark fruit, cocoa, and subtle spice.

•*Sip*: Let the tannins dance.

•*Pair*: Try it with BBQ ribs, roasted lamb, or truffle fries. It's bold enough to stand up to rich flavors but smooth enough to stay elegant.



Siglo is a wine with a lot of history.

Its origin dates back to 1927, one of Rioja's historic wineries, the oldest winery in Fuenmayor. Siglo brand pays tribute to the time that Rioja wine had been among the people of the town (S.XVIII). It was not until the end of the Spanish Civil War that the emblem of the brand was born: the Siglo Saco. The sack was an innovative jute cover, inspired by the Rioja tradition in which workers, who worked in the fields all day from dawn, wrapped the wine bottle with a damp cloth to keep the wine fresh. Today, Siglo continues this tradition in collaboration with Asprodema, an NGO that promotes people with intellectual disabilities, which covers the bottles by hand with the Sack.
